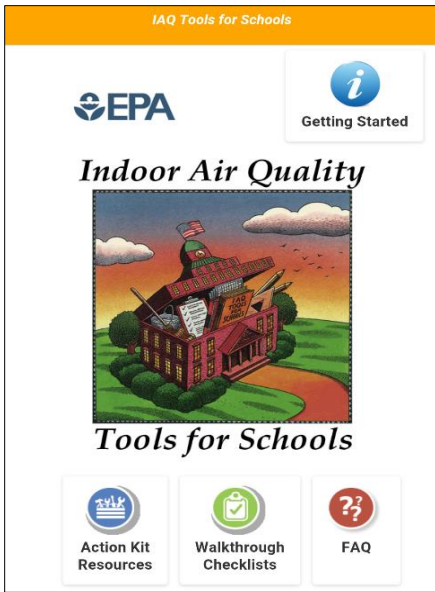


EPA Indoor Air Quality (IAQ) Tools for Schools Mobile App



What is the “School IAQ Assessment Tool” mobile app?

- Portable, one-stop shop for accessing guidance from EPA’s *Indoor Air Quality Tools for Schools Action Kit*
- Easy to use tool to help collect data, identify IAQ concerns, and validate good IAQ practices already in place
- Can be used as a central tracking mechanism by schools and districts to organize building assessments, and identify and prioritize IAQ improvements

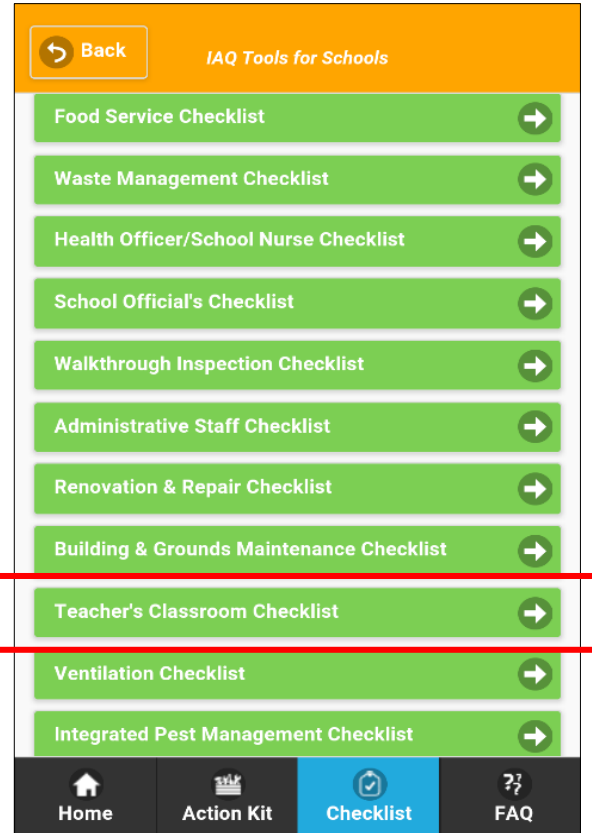
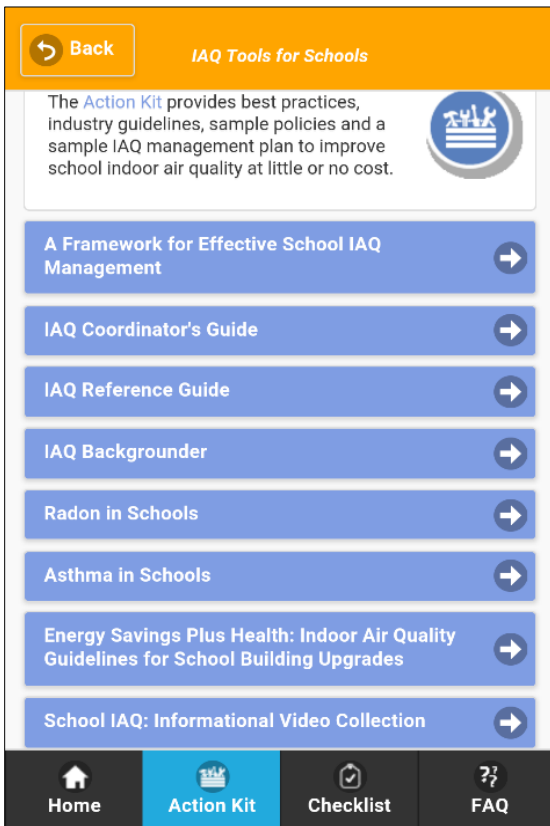
Mobile app components

The mobile application is compatible with both Apple and Android devices; search for “School IAQ Assessment Tool” in the respective app stores.

There are two main components:

- 1) Resources from the *IAQ Tools for Schools Action Kit*
- 2) A collection of targeted checklists to assess IAQ in schools

- App allows walkthrough data to be easily downloaded from the app into a spreadsheet and emailed for review; it also has a feature for taking notes and photos as you conduct the assessment



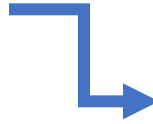
Screenshot of "Teacher's Classroom Checklist"
