Asthma is not just a health issue, it's an education issue.

Asthma is the chronic disease that causes the most school absenteeism.¹

- Children suffer from high rates of asthma in Massachusetts (14% in Boston)²
- Children who aren't in school can't learn

Poor Indoor Air Quality doesn't just affect students:

- It can cause **chronic respiratory problems** and **reduce school staff's ability** to perform mental tasks requiring concentration, calculation or memory
- Teachers and custodians have high rates of workrelated asthma³

Healthy, high performing schools = healthy, high performing students

Did you know?

- Asthma is often a cause of student absenteeism
- Many things in the school building can cause a child to have an asthma attack:
 - Pests, like mice and roaches
 - Pesticides
 - Dust, often from clutter
 - Bleach and disinfecting products
 - Other scented cleaning products

Create a healthier learning environment by:

- Participating in the school wellness committees
- Educate teachers, administrators and other staff about safe pest management and the IPM log
- Advocate for increased funding so you can make needed repairs
